UT RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

“In residence” refers to courses taken at UT Austin; it does not include credit-by-exam, extension, or distance education courses. All of the following must be completed in residence:

- At least two long semesters or an equivalent period of time.
- A total of 60 hours.
- 24 hours in business, on a letter-grade basis.
- 12 upper-division hours, on a letter-grade basis, from the major coursework.
- 24 of the last 30 hours

SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY, PART I

Six hours in a single field of study.

The following courses may be counted:

Non-science major courses:

- **Astronomy** 301 and choose one from: 309G, 309L, 309N, 309R, 309S
- **Biology** 301D, 301L, 301M
- **Chemistry** 304K & 305
- **Geological Sciences** 302C, 302D, 302E, 302M, 303C
- **Marine Science** 307, 308
- **Natural Sciences** 306J, 306K, 306L, and 306M (speak with an advisor)
- **Physics & Physical Science** PHY 309K & 309L or P S 303 & 304

Courses for students wanting more technical content (i.e. Pre-Med):

- **Astronomy** 307 and choose one from: 309G, 309L, 309N, 309R, 309S
- **Biology** 311C, 311D, 315H, 325H, 326M, 446L, 365S (Complete one of the following recommended pairs: BIO311C and 311D, BIO 311C and 326M, BIO 311C and 446L, BIO 311C and 365S, BIO 315H and 325H)
- **Chemistry** 301, 301H, 302, 302H (Students should complete one of the following pairs of courses: Chemistry 301 and 302, 301H and 302H)
- **Geological Sciences** 401, 303, 404C, 405 (Only one of the following may be counted: Geological Sciences 401 or 303. Geological Sciences 404C may not be paired with 405)
- **Physics** 301, 302K, 302L, 303K, 303L, 316, 317K, 317L (It is recommended that students complete one of the following pairs of courses: Physics 301 and 316, or 302K and 302L, or 303K and 303L, or 317K and 317L.)

Three hours in a field of study **different** from the field counted toward Science & Technology Part I.

CRITERIA FOR THE OPTIONAL MINOR

- Students may complete one minor. The minor may be business or non-business.
- Twelve hours in a single field with at least nine hours being upper-division.
- The Internship course may not be counted toward the minor.
- Six of the hours for the minor must be taken in-residence.
- Courses for a minor must be taken on a letter-grade basis unless they are only offered on a pass/fail basis.
- Students must meet the prerequisites and other department restrictions placed on courses for the minor.
